REMOVAL OF PRIVATELY OWNED EQUIPMENT & LONG STAY EMPTY CONTAINERS FROM THE PORT OF MOMBASA

The Ports Authority is undertaking a port clean-up exercise to free the yard areas and to maximize the use of all spaces to enhance safe and efficient operations/ service delivery.

Following an equipment survey exercise conducted in the Port of Mombasa, it has been observed that there are: privately owned idle equipment, stalled vehicles, tools, and long-stay empty containers lying idle within the port premises and in sick bays.

Owners are hereby notified and required to make arrangements for their evacuation from the Port premises within 14 days from the date of this Notice, i.e. by close of business on 7th May 2024.

You are required to make payment of all charges due to the Authority prior to their evacuation. A schedule listing all the overstayed empty containers may be obtained from the office of the Manager Container Operations.

Please note that in the event of your failure to comply with this Notice, the Ports Authority will dispose of the equipment, long-stay containers, and any of the aforementioned items in accordance with the Kenya Ports Authority Act to defray any charges due in their respect, without any further reference to the owners.
